"Decisions, How Do We Make Them?" by Eddie Moser

One way is carnally using our thinking and deduction process to come to a decision about something. This is what Moses did when TOLD by God he would be sent to free the Israelites from slavery. He told God that he was slow of speech (Ex 4:10). But God reminded Moses who provided speech, He Himself, and that he would go with him and help him speak (Ex 4:11 – 12). When that didn't work Moses asked God to send someone else. (Ex 4:13). Moses really didn't want to do what God was instructing him to do sound familiar?? God became angry with Moses (Ex 4:14) and told him he would send Aaron to speak for him. Ultimately, Moses got the message and complied with God's instructions and went to Egypt and we know how that turned out. This is a good reminder that when we are asked to do something for the Lord that we don't want to do or feel we are not qualified to do, we need to go to God in prayer and ask his direction about the matter a better way to make decisions. And when he speaks thru his Holy Spirit, we need to listen to God's still small voice telling us what His will is. We need to put our faith into action and believe that God will qualify us and be with us as we do His will. So often we miss a blessing for ourselves and for others by not having faith that God is with us and helping us do the task at hand. We display disobedience and unbelief in God by not seeking Him in our decision-making process. We really need to get into the habit, when confronted with something we don't want to do or think we can't do, to go to God in prayer and ask what He wants us to do. This will result in a much more positive experience for us and God will be pleased with us. Being obedient overcomes our self-pride and builds our confidence and faith in ourselves and God. Remember how God defines Faith in Hebrews 11:1 ... "Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see". We can't see faith, but we do see the results of being faithful. So, let's seek God's direction and instruction when faced with a decision and be a mighty force for His kingdom just like Moses ended up being.


